

If you are going to be in charge of someone's death arrangements some day, or want more control of your own demise, this program will be especially beneficial. Addressed will be such end-of-life issues as • Choices of final disposition, • Prices and ways to save money, • Pitfalls and warnings, • Consumer rights, • What you can and can't do, • Shopping for a funeral, • Cemetery choices, • Should we pre-pay? • Why pre-planning pays off, • Ecological choices, • New trends in death care. FCA is celebrating 60 years of service this year. They give impartial information, help people plan funerals, and are watchdogs over funeral law. Questions that will be answered during this Supplement will include: What is the Hospice Philosophy? Who is eligible? What services/benefits are provided? Who is on the Hospice team? Our presenter is Ed Wendler, who says that when his volunteer position with the Emergency Housing Consortium concluded in 2009, choosing 'Hospice of the Valley' as his next endeavor was easy. "I remembered the support my family received from hospice care when my mother was dying. It was time to payback that gift." Ed hopes that his presentation will help people access hospice care sooner and receive as much support as possible during this difficult time.
