Aligning Artificial Intelligence with our UU Principles

The recent developments in Generative Artificial Intelligence have been astounding in their capacity to mimic human creativity, with ChatGPT in particular becoming an overnight sensation. Many people have expressed concerns about the dangers of these systems, including the spread of misinformation, the exacerbation of social inequities, and threats to democratic institutions. Less well-known is the increasing exploitation of the millions of lowpaid workers responsible for the data used to train Al models. As someone who has worked on Al products for over twenty years, Karin will discuss how all of these are real causes for concern, and challenge us as UUs to advocate for the alignment of AI development with our principles.

A Year of Transition

Knowing that we would be without a Minister for most of the summer if not longer, the Board and others in the Congregation began in March to put together plans to be a lay-led ministry. Surveys and focus groups were conducted to gather input from the Congregation, and teams are being formed. I am incredibly impressed by the number of people who have stepped up to volunteer!

Teams we will be relying on include our new Sunday Services Coordinator Team, Worship Associates, and Tech Team, the folks who produce our hybrid services.
