#### **UUA Presidential Election**

General Assembly delegates elected a new faith leader this June, Reverend Dr. Sofía

## Community Outreach Update

Recent outreach from Social Justice & Climate Action includes approval of a \$200 donation to the Amah Mutsun Land Acquisition Fund during the SURJ (Showing Up for Racial Justice at Sacred Heart) spring matching fundraising drive. This donation directly supports the return of ancestral lands into Amah Mutsun hands.

Our contributions come from a non-religious fund from which we donate to nonprofits, mostly local, that align with UU values.
