
News from General Assembly Pittsburgh (+ virtual), June 21-25 2023

In addition to electing a new president, delegates voted to move forward with a process to discuss further the proposed changes to Article II of the UUA bylaws with 86.3% of voters* in favor. Article II is the section that includes our Principles, Purposes, and Sources. The intent of the changes is to make them more inclusive. <u>Three amendments</u> to the proposed values were approved. A final vote on the proposed changes requires a twothirds vote to pass next year at GA 2024.

*Only 42% of electors voted. UUFS had no representatives at GA this year so could not vote. Note that next year's GA will be allvirtual, and UUFS can send two representatives.

Does your Employer Match your Charitable Donations?

Can you increase your contributions to UUFS through employer matching? Many companies in our area will match charitable donations of their employees or allow special grants to be sent to your charity. UUFS works through an organization that employers use called <u>Benevity</u> to consolidate employer matches.

Most employers do not allow their share to go toward religious or political causes, so UUFS tracks those contributions in our special Social Justice Non-religious Fund. For example, the matching funds cannot count toward pledges, which are needed for rent and salaries, and are considered a religious expense. However, these funds enable us to donate to local nonreligious causes such as homeless shelters, food banks, and immigrant services.

So, ask your HR department if this is one of your company benefits, or contact <u>treasurer@uufs.org</u> to find out if your company uses Benevity, which certifies charities like UUFS for eligibility. Thank you.
