Letter from Debbie Timmers, President, UUFS Board of Trustees

Welcome to September! This month has often been thought of as the beginning of the church year for UUs. This year we have something very special to celebrate as Reverend John M. Bloom-Ramirez has signed a one-year contract agreeing to be our new part-time minister. We are excited that he will be participating in our Water Ceremony with us. Stay tuned for details about when he will first take the pulpit, his office hours, and more.

The Water Ceremony is our traditional way of marking our return from summer activities as we celebrate being together again. For this ritual, each person brings to the service a small amount of water from a source that has personal meaning (from a vacation, a favorite park, your childhood home, or even just from your home faucet). You will get a chance in the service to merge your water with everyone else's water. You may want to say something, or not, about what this water means to you. This observance reflects how we, like water, may also come from many different sources, but we come together through our shared seven principles.

The history behind this ritual is very interesting. It was created in 1980 by Carolyn McDade, songwriter, and Lucile Schuck Longview, a longtime leader in the Women & Religion UU movement. If you are curious, you can read more about it here.

I'm excited about the Fall curricula in our Children's Religious Education program and am looking forward to joining with our congregation and friends this month as we continue to share our journey and move into this consequential new season together.

Children's Religious Education: September Update from Colleen Hamilton

During this season of ingathering, I am happy to announce some developments in the UUFS Children's Religious Education program that will more consistently orient our children and youth toward a Unitarian Universalist perspective.

For children in the Sunday morning program, Miss Leah and I will be structuring our lessons around a multi-age curriculum from <u>Soul Matters</u> <u>Sharing Circle</u>, a UU collaboration network. This year, their curriculum is designed around the

proposed Article II "values and inspirations" that advanced by vote at the June UUA General Assembly that re-envision the "principles and sources" adopted in 1985.* I'm excited for participants to grapple with our purposes as Unitarian Universalists in the 21st century. We will share our learnings when we visit the sanctuary on the last Sundays of the coming months.

Also beginning in September, youth aged 11-18 will have the opportunity to meet with me after the service to discuss Unitarian Universalism while learning about other faith communities in our area. This will be a pilot 6-week mini-session of a Soul Matters curriculum called Crossing Paths, a version of the impactful Neighboring Faiths youth programs used throughout our UU congregations. Focused on one other faith community, the session will culminate in a visit to a neighboring place of worship. Families with youth in this age group should mark their calendars for September 10 to October 15 and contact me at redirector@uufs.org to register.

This month, I'm looking forward to curling up with a new book in our Climate Reading and Discussion Circle: Bicycling with Butterflies: My 10,201-mile Journey Following the Monarch Migration by Sara Dykman. And don't forget our intercongregational Game Night on Saturday, September 2nd. Find more information in our Activities section below.

Finally, join me at the Fall Fest at Mission Peak UU Congregation in Fremont on Saturday, September 23rd from 1:00-3:00 p.m. Celebrate the turning of the season, and the Autumn Equinox, by celebrating the Earth itself and be inspired to learn as a family about making choices that limit our impact on the planet.
