SALES ITEMS

All items donated by our deadline of April 28 are summarized below. Homemade goods will be displayed and marked at pre-established, fixed prices in a room in the Religious Exploration class area and are available for immediate sale.

Silent auction bid sheets will be displayed on May 19 on a table under an awning near the Religious Exploration classrooms for gift cards, larger items, and hosted events. Contact information will be provided to the winning bidders and to donors if item pickup or logistics need to be coordinated. ***Please read descriptions carefully for possible restrictions, limitations, and dates.***

BIDDING RULES

Winning bidders will be determined at the end of the auction. ***Please write legibly.*** We'll do our best to decipher handwriting, but illegible names on bid sheets will not be considered.

Bidders may use proxies and need not be present to win provided payment can be made in a timely manner by, or on behalf of, the winner.

Minimum bids and minimum bid increments will be specified on each bid sheet. If there are multiple bids on items of limited availability, winners will be those who bid highest; if there are multiple bids of the same amount, winners will be those who bid first.

Donors may choose to schedule a second event if there are enough bidders.

PAYMENT

Payment may be made by cash, check or PayPal at any time during the sale of edibles and small, home made items. Silent Auction items can be paid for at the close of the auction or, if you bid and win multiple items, you may wait to learn and pay the total amount due; it is anticipated that notices to the winners will be made by mid-June.
